ARCHITECTURE PROJECT

We are working with Nottingham City Council and the Urban Room on the Carrington Street Townscape Heritage Programme, which aims to link the railway station with future improvements around the Broadmarsh area. The project involves pupils working with external lead professionals to bring together technology and creativity by looking at the past, present and future of the street.

- 1 A musical piece that we will compose based on the architectural features of the facades and mathematics behind the designs.
- 2 A literacy narrative.
- 3 A design for a building that follows the Carrington Street trend. We will draw this in a 3D modelling software and produce a 3D design.
- 4 A piece of art (image or sculpture).
- 5 Videography of the project.

The final project outcomes will be exhibited at the Urban Room on Carrington Street in a dedicated evening event on Thursday 28th November 2019.
