ARCHITECTURE PROJECT

A group of pupils from Years 6 to 10 started a very exciting project last academic year in March.


We worked with Nottingham City Council and the 38 Carrington St Urban Room Partnership on the Carrington Street Townscape Heritage Programme, which aims to link the railway station with future improvements around the Broadmarsh area. The project involved pupils working with external lead professionals to bring together technology and creativity by looking at the past, present and future of the street.

On Thursday 28th November, pupils presented the final pieces from the project at a dedicated event at the Urban Room:

1. A musical piece that was composed based on the architectural features of the façades and mathematics behind the designs
2. A literacy narrative
3. A design for a building that follows the Carrington Street trend using 3D modelling software
4. A piece of art (sculpture)
5. Videography of the project

Dr Laura Alvarez (Senior Principal Urban Design and Conservation Officer at Nottingham City Council) said "it is rare for young children to be so involved in a long term project with city planning professionals and this group of pupils have certainly set precedent for new ways of working. The project has shown the value of informing children about their environment and the ways in which they can make a contribution to shaping their city, as citizens."

A massive thank you to Dr Alvarez, Mr Thompson and Mrs Howlett for making this extraordinary project possible and to all the children involved for excelling in every element.
