Enabling

In our EYFS class, all children follow the Early Years curriculum. Working in small groups with a teacher for carpet-time, the children learn their phonics, writing skills, numbers and topic work. Next Steps

Our Junior School takes children aged 5 to 11 into Key Stage One (Years 1 and 2) and Key Stage Two (Years 3 to 6). Those who join from the EYFS class are seamlessly integrated. Whilst children begin to access their new curriculum in Year 1, we also ensure all Early Years' goals are met. We are one big happy family. All our pupils know each other well and play harmoniously together at break times. With lots of dressing up opportunities, baking and making, shows and concerts, as well as a full extra-curricular programme; life in our Junior School is busy, challenging and exciting.

As children move through Key Stage One and Two, the links with the Senior School increase and more specialist teachers become involved so the transition to Year 7 is smooth and easy.











Supporting

In order to promote high level literacy skills, teachers will listen to children read every day until it is no longer required. As well as developing cognitively, our pupils are encouraged to take pride in the presentation of their work. We think handwriting is important; children develop their cursive writing through Key Stage One and use a fountain pen from Year 4. Our small classes ensure that we can stretch or support all abilities to enable all to succeed.
